

JOINT MEETING OF MARATHON, LINCOLN, PORTAGE, AND WOOD COUNTY GENEALOGICAL SOCIETIES

Fellow genealogists are invited to join us Monday, July 16th, for a joint meeting of the four central Wisconsin counties of Lincoln, Marathon, Portage, and Wood, beginning at 7:00 p.m.

The guest speaker will be Mr. Jerry Viste, President and Chief Operating Officer of Wausau Insurance Companies, who is also an avid genealogist. The title of his presentation will be "GENEALOGY AND THE HOME COMPUTER" which will be of interest to all, even though you might not own a home computer. Mr. Viste and his wife, Barney, have travelled extensively doing genealogical research.

The meeting will be held in Room 120 of the Marathon County Commission on Aging building at 212 River Drive, Wausau. Those of you coming into Wausau from the North and West, follow Stewart Avenue and Washington Street to River Drive (immediately to the right before you get to the Mall intersection of Washington St. and First Avenue). Those coming from the East and South through Schofield, follow Grand Avenue to the Wausau Fire Station at the intersection of Grand Ave. and Thomas St., turn left onto Thomas Street for a block and turn right onto River Drive. Follow River Drive approximately 5 blocks until you see the Commission on Aging building on the left.

Parking is available in front of the Commission on Aging building. Please use the entrance on the far right off the parking lot and go straight down the corridor to Room 120. We plan to start the meeting at 7:30 sharp and will serve refreshments from 7 to 7:30 and again after the meeting.

Recently, one of my relatives has been spending a lot of time at the Wisconsin State Historical Society in Madison researching our family history. Through her I have learned that many people are infected with the genealogy bug and that the Historical Society has a wealth of information.

While she is busy in the stacks she has her car parked in our hotel parking lot which is located less than two blocks from the Historical Society. She has asked me to make a map available for publication in her Genealogy Club's Newsletter. While doing this, I thought that more of you might be interested in this information. Parking rates are \$1.00 for the first hour, 50¢ for each hour after that, or \$5.00 a day. We just need you to stop in at the front desk with your license plate number.

We would also like to extend to you our discounted University rates should you decide that one day isn't enough to get all your research done. Our regular single rate is \$38.00, but with the discount it would be \$29.00, plus tax. This is the best bargain in the downtown area and our rooms are very nice and spacious. We have a restaurant on premises, cable, color TV and direct dial phone. Continental Breakfast is included and parking is free to our guests.

We are centrally located on Madison's State Street Mall. The Mall begins at the University of Wisconsin Campus and extends seven blocks to the State Capitol Building. All of the shopping, entertainment and dining that State Street has to offer is right out the front door. And with the Historical Society being so close, this is a very convenient location for you.
