Sue LaSavage recently purchased a book, "Pedigree Charts of the Milwaukee County Genealogical Society, Inc." which she would be happy to share with other members of the Marshfield Area Genealogy Group.

The book contains nearly 800 five generation ancestor charts from members of the Milwaukee Genealogical Society. The charts are arranged in alphabetical order with an every name index found in the rear of the book. Addresses of persons submitting charts are also provided.

Heritage Book, Monroe County, WI 1984. The book contains many personal sketches of Monroe residents.

Gazetteer of New York State, 1860 by J.H. French. This book contains a complete history and description of every county, city, town, village and locality in New York during 1860.

Hall's Ireland, 1841. This work was originally intended to be a tour of the country, but the finished product was much more. It was a personal record of the Hall's Ireland, and they reported on whatever took their interests. Their county by county account of this journey provides a valuable look at pre-famine Ireland.

MARATHON COUNTY 1905 WISCONSIN STATE CENSUS

The Register of Deeds Office at the Marathon County Courthouse, Wausau has two file cabinets with the original cards used in the fills 1905 State Census. This approximately six drawers. The registrar, Mr. Gernetzky, has stated that people may use these records but discourages people from requesting staff help, be-cause of lack of staff time. The same records are available on microfilm at the State Historical Society Library in Madison. -- from Pinery Pedigree, Marathon County Genealogical Society.

BLACK AND WHITE PHOTOS

A "properly processed and stored" black and white photograph could last 500 years or more. Color prints may last 30 years. Historic Photographs, such as from weddings and portraits, should be reprocessed in black and white.

Albums utilizing black construction paper are bad for old photos as are the "magnetic" ones which contain sulfur and PVC that attack photos.—from the Antique Week, Genealogy Week Section.

PLANNING A RESEARCH TRIP

The following tips are offered to those planning an upcoming research trip.

- Be sure to write ahead to the library of office you wish to search. Find out the hours and any policies that may affect your search.
- 2) Map out your trip to take advantage of every minute. Know the location of cemeteries, churches, historical societies or libraries that you may want to search.
- Prepare an outline of records or information you hope to find. Using a checklist to help you remain organized as you go about your searching.
- 4) Take enough pencils, paper and coins to get you through your day of research, recording and copying.
- 5) Go on every research trip with a positive attitude, every find, big or small, makes the trip a success. Above all, always remember your research is suppose to be fun!!!
