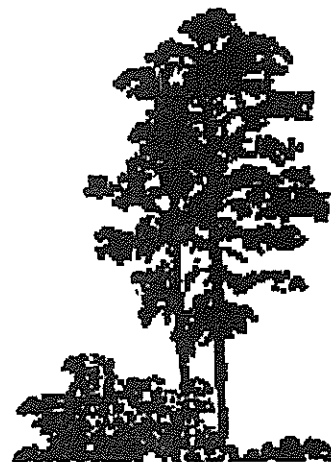

THOUGHTS FOR QUERY ANSWERERS

1. The query placer probably has little or no information from before the generation asked about in the query. Otherwise, people wouldn't place the query in that generation.
2. The query placer usually writes a query because he seeks correspondence with people who know more about his ancestors and not because he wants to give out information. Many people are reluctant to give out more information than they receive.
3. Some surnames are quite common. Writing is worthless unless something in the query makes kinship seem quite likely.
4. Geographical proximity must always be remembered. It is wise to answer only if:
 - a. your ancestors that you are writing about come from the same or later time period.
 - b. Geographical proximity or family names make the relation seem possible.
 - c. The surname is rather uncommon
 - d. You can provide the query placer with information relevant to his quest.

If you have trouble locating certain ancestors, it could be because of the following census facts:

1790 Washington DC is with Montgomery and Prince Georges counties in Maryland

1820-1830 Wisconsin is with the Michigan census

1830 Iowa territory census includes Minnesota

1840 Montana is with Clayton County, Iowa

1860 Colorado is with Kansas census. Montana is found with Nebraska census under "Unorganized Territory". Nevada is included with Utah census. Oklahoma is with Arkansas which was then Indian Land. Wyoming is with Nebraska.

Prior to 1880 IA meant Indiana, NOT Iowa.

Virginia covered many thousands of square miles more than it does now. A reference made to a person having been born in Virginia could mean that he or she was born in part of Illinois (1781-1816), Missouri (1775-1863), North Carolina (1728-1803), Ohio (1728-1803), Pennsylvania (1752-1786), Tennessee (1760-1803), West Virginia

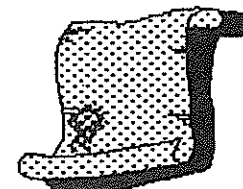
