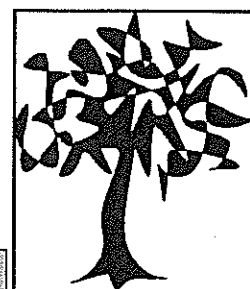

| 1850-present | Masonic 4-sided stones; |
| 1860-1900 | Pylons, columns, and all exotic-type monuments |
| 1870-1900 | Zinc monuments |
| 1900- | Granite, now common, came into use ca. 1900. |

GERMAN (AID) SOCIETY

The records of the German (aid) Society of Chicago (Deutsche Gesellschaft) consist of more than 10,000 applications for assistance and case histories from the period 1883-1910. Applications include the applicant's name, address, age, family relationships, occupation, length of time in the United States, and place of origin. Some applications from clients of the Swiss Benevolent Society of Chicago, which did not have its own quarter, are included. These records are housed at the University of Illinois at Chicago, University Library, Special Collections, Room 3330, 801 S. Morgan, Chicago. IL 60607.

The collection is open to the general public from Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. There is no fee to use the collection. Please note: the library staff is unable to respond to mail inquiries and cannot do research. You must go yourself or hire someone to search through the applications, which are not indexed.

1862 HOMESTEAD ACT

If your ancestor obtained land under the 1862 Homestead Act, or bought land from the government, the application is sure to be on file. These files hold a four-page questionnaire filed by the applicant (among other papers). Included are the names of family members and other data. Write to Civil Archives Division, National Archives and Records Service, General Services Administration, Washington, D.C. 20409.

Not all cities or counties had directories done but check it out. It may fill in some of the blanks or give you clues if others of the surname were in the area.

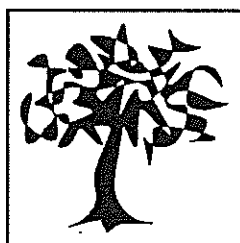
