
Architectural Style: Mediterranean Revival “20th Century Commercial”

Paulson Super Service Station

Built in 1931 by Albert Paulson, the Super Service Station was then the newest full service filling station in the city. The lot had been used as Paulson Brothers Auto Exchange auto & tire sales area for years; & the building has been utilized for many purposes since. Its Mediterranean roots are subtle. The importance of the main entry, with a red tiled roof; tiles set around & emphasizing the structural elements which form the angled tripartite entry, making them look like the tops of substantial piers; Roman arched windows outlined in red; the arch above the door inset with a red fan pattern. Also the horizontal emphasis with continuous red banding along the roof's long low parapet wall, & band of windows along 4th which replace original garage bay entries.
