Arrived with Louis Rivers and family on April 1, 1872 to fall the first tree and help build Marshfield’s first building, a log hotel.

Witnessed the Great Marshfield Fire and first woman elected to the Marshfield City Council

Marshfield’s best known World War I hero

Early Marshfield industrialist and prominent businessman, Mayor during the Great Marshfield Fire, and the only Marshfield resident to serve as Wisconsin’s governor.

Early Marshfield civic leader, mentor of the Marshfield youth, and leader of the relief effort after the Great Marshfield Fire

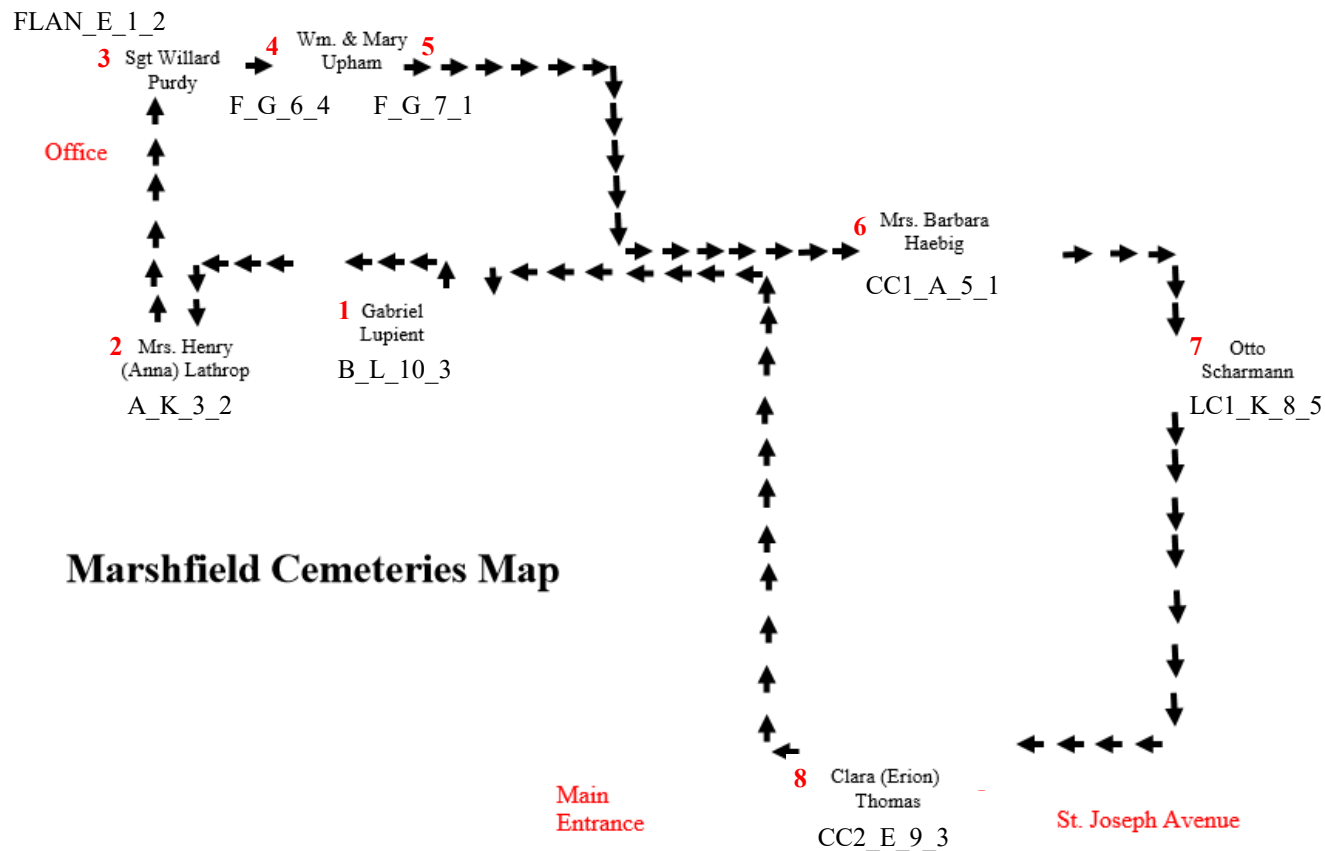
